Mariam Thresia, A Mystic Saint

Pope Francis said, "Consecrated life is a journey of love to the existential peripheries" as he canonized Mariam Thresia, a religious and mystic with four others on 13 October, 2019.

Mariam Thresia was born in Puthenchira in Kerala on 26 April, 1876 in a rich and noble family. She grew up in piety and holiness under the guidance of her saintly mother, Thanda. In her intense love for God, the eight year old girl gave herself to austere penance, fasting and prayer. She wanted to be conformed ever more to the likeness of the suffering Christ, to whom she also consecrated her virginity at an early age. In imitation of Christ she helped the poor, nursed the sick, visited and comforted the lonely people of her parish. She was also blessed with the stigmata, but kept it secret to avoid attention. She received several mystical gifts like prophesy, healing, an aura of light sweet odour and frequently had ecstasies and levitations. Her entire existence was tormented by demons, and she offered her suffering for the remission of the sins of the world.

Thresia, and her three companions who joined her, led a life of austere penance and continued to help families, visiting the sick, the poor and needy. This ministry led her to start a new Congregation of the Holy family on 14 May, 1914.

Sr. Mariam Thresia died on 8 June, 1926 at the age of 50. Pope John Paul II named the late religious as Venerable on 28 June 1999 after he confirmed that she had lived a life of heroic virtue. The investigation of the miracle required for beatification was held in the Trichur eparchy from 28 April 1992 to 26 July 1993 and was validated on 22 January 1999 before receiving the approval of the medical board on 16 November 1999. Theologians then voiced their own approval on 5 January 2000.

The miracle was that of the cure of Mr. Mathew D. Pellissery, who was born in 1956 with congenital club feet. He could barely walk with great difficulty on the sides of his feet until he was fourteen.

After 33 days of fasting and prayer by the whole family, invoking the help of Mariam Thresia, his right foot was straightened during sleep on the night of 21 August 1970. Similarly after 39 days of fasting and prayer his left foot was also straightened overnight during sleep on 28 August 1971. Since then, Mathew has been able to walk normally. This double healing was declared inexplicable in terms of medical science by as many as nine doctors in India and Italy and thus met the last canonical requirement for her beatification. It was declared a miracle obtained through the intercession of Mariam Thresia by the C.C.S. on 18 January 2000 before the Pope himself issued final approval on it on 27 January 2000. John Paul II beatified Mariam Thresia on 9 April 2000 in Saint Peter's Square. Mathew Pellissery was present there during the beatification ceremony at St. Peter's Square.

The second miracle and the one needed for her canonization was investigated in the diocese of its origin and later received the formal validation of the C.C.S. in Rome on 24 June 2014. The miraculous healing of the child Christopher, who had a life threatening respiratory problem. The doctors had prescribed a particular medicine through a special ventilator which was not available at that time. On the third day the child was gasping for breath, the doctors sounded alarm bell.

The parents and grandparents who are great devotees of Mariam Thresia placing a relic of the blessed urged all to pray earnestly to Mariam Thresia. There was drastic improvement in the child in about 20-30 minutes. The immediate healing could not be explained medically. This miracle was presented and received approval from the medical board in Rome in March 2018 and theologians later confirmed it in October 2018. Pope Francis approved this miracle on 12 February 2019 which cleared her for canonization.

5th Diocesan Youth Convention





The long awaited 5th Diocesan Youth Convention of Catholic Diocese of Baruipur was held from 11th to 14th October 2019 at Carmel High School for girls, Keorapukur. The youth director of Baruipur Diocese, Rev. Fr. Ramen Pailan along with the members of Diocesan Committee (DEXCO) and local organizing committee (LOC) heartily welcomed 370 youths who came to be part of this grand celebration from various parishes of Baruipur Diocese. The inaugural Mass was offered by Rt. Rev. Cyprian Monis, Bishop of Asansol Diocese and concelebrated by the diocesan priests. "Pope declared this month as mission month", said Bishop Monis as he shared his experience in his homily. The inaugural programme started with Flag Hoisting Ceremony. The 5th DYC was inaugurated by chief guest of the day Rt. Rev. Cyprin Monis. Youth Director, Rev. Fr. Ramen Pailan gave a short inaugural address and the guest of honour, the Councillor of 142 ward, Mr. Raghunath Patra expressed his views on the upliftment of the youth in the present context. At the end of first day of Convention theme song was performed followed by cultural programme and vote of thanks proposed by Mr. Sarbeswar Chakraborty (DYP). The day ended with the cultural programme.

On the 2nd day, main celebrant was Rev. Fr. J. A. Santhanam, the Rector of Morning Star College, Barrackpore in his sermon insisted the youth to

Home for the Sick and Elderly Priests



As a religious practice the catholic priests turn their back to their families and go forth to carry the cross to follow Christ and advance His mission. Bereft of support from family and their shifting flocks, sick and elderly priests seem to see a dark tunnel ahead. It is here that Baruipur diocesan authorities have stepped in to ensure a worry-free, comfortable life to ailing and aging priests with an establishment of a home for them. This would enable them to lead reasonably happy lives with hardly any tension, as they had the confidence that diocese would take care of them when needed.

For last few years, the idea of having one centralized facility for retired priests of the diocese got crystallized and accordingly Rev. Fr. Pradeep Roy, one of the senior most priests in the diocese, blessed the laying of the foundation for a new house on 15 November 2018. Tuesday, 22 October, 2019 will be forever etched in the annals of Baruipur Diocese as a truly historic day. On this day the dream of the diocese to have its own home for the sick and elderly priests found its concrete expression with the

blessing and inauguration of a new residence by Most Rev. Linus Nirmal Gomes S.J., the bishop emeritus of the diocese in the accompaniment of present bishop, Salvadore Lobo and Coadjutor bishop, Shyamal Bose who presided over the Holy Eucharist. Bishop Salvadore Lobo in his edifying homily put emphasis on Respect to Elders, an adage older than the individuals it urges us to revere. He underscored, 'as medical science and other factors lead to long life, it is important to recognize the presence of the growing number of older people as a blessing for the Church and society. We can learn from the experience of the generation that preceded us. Blessing of this house is to be considered as repayment of the gratitude, rather than showing our generosity.

The Church has always great respect for the older people. The forth commandment: "Honour your father and mother as the Lord your God commanded you." God wants a proper respect for the dignity and the health and wellbeing of the elderly. He also alarmed that they are to be safeguarded from slipping into isolation and depression during the sunset years of their lives. Thus, learning from, being inspired by and supporting them with a visit and phone calls would paint a more expansive picture of what respect should look like.'

The construction of this ailing and aging-friendly building, with all required amenities, was closely monitored and managed by Rev. Fr. Saumen Malik, director of Pastoral Centre and coordinator of diocesan commissions. We appreciate and thank him for his service. A Month of Celebrations


