## Unity in Diversity for the Mission of Mercy

Indian Constitution is acclaimed as one of the best constitutions of a democratic country in the world as it upholds unity of the nation in spite of diversity of languages, religions, cultures and regions. It stands on four pillars of democracy viz. Justice, Liberty, equality and fraternity. 176 bishops gathered in St. John's Medical College Hospital, Bangalore, for the 33 biennial meeting discussed on "Unity in diversity for the Mission of Mercy". To Live in Unity in the midst of Diversity, both within the Church and in the country, the bishops proposed 20 points of which I place 13 of them before the readers of Baruipur News letter:

1. We shall deepen and intensify our Christian life of discipleship at all levels by being a ceaselessly praying community, always living our unity in diversity in accordance with our Trinitarian faith.
2. We shall promote and intensify Small Christian Communities (SCCs) and Family Units for the all-round integral formation of the faithful and for inter-religious cooperation, peace and harmony.
3. We shall accompany families in their evangelizing mission in the world and to make sure that they become the focal point of the pastoral ministry of the Church; to manifest special care and compassion to families in distress and to enlighten our families on responsible parenthood.
4. We shall imbue our youth with the vision of an authentic Christian Life to enable them to play their role in Church and society; to empower our youth to play an active role in the Church by equipping them with the knowledge of the Word of God and with the teachings of the Church through the Indian Catholic Youth Movement (ICYM) and other Catholic Youth Movements; to help our youth to discern and choose the way of life which is the primary theme of the forthcoming Synod on Youth in Oct 2018.
5. We shall encourage and train our lay people and youth for nation-building through involvement in vitally important areas of our national life such as politics, civil services, defence, law and judiciary.
6. We shall ensure adequate representation of women in all Church bodies.
7. We shall make the Constitution of India more widely known in all sectors of Church and society, particularly highlighting some salient features such as the equality of all citizens, the freedom of religion, the freedom of conscience and the freedom of expression.
8. We shall encourage and motivate our laity to be actively involved in the secular world in order to effectively contribute to nation-building in fulfillment of their proper vocation.
9. We shall continue to make our service in the field of education a mission of mercy and to implement purposefully the "All India Catholic Education Policy 2007" of the CBCI in order to impart Gospel values.
10. We shall increase awareness of the importance of ecology as an integral part of our Christian commitment and spirituality and to take new initiatives to protect the environment and to promote love for Nature; to ensure that every diocese has formulated an environment policy to implement the teachings of Laudato Si, the Encyclical Letter of Pope Francis.
11. We shall create an awareness of the plight of our brothers and sisters in prison and to assist them in their rehabilitation and the care of their families.
12. We shall ensure transparency in all spheres of the Church's administration and to stand for the same in society.

During the biennial meeting of CBCI held in St. John's Medical College Hospital, Bangalore, our Bishop was re-elected as chairman for CBCI office for Social Communication and NISCORT for another period of 4 years. The commission consist of three members. The other two are **Most Rev. Sebastian Kallupura of Buxar** and **Most Rev. Anthony Poola of Kurnool**.



In the last Standing Committee of CBCI he is also appointed Chairman of a Ad Hoc Committee for revamping and strengthening the finances of CBCI. The other members of the commission are Archbishop Bernard Moras of Bangalore, Archbishop Albert D'Souza of Agra, Mr. Guilherme Vaz of Mumbai and Dr. N.J. Kurien of New Delhi.

Hons in Bengali. 80 of our students received their Degree Certificates this year, and many are now pursuing postgraduate studies. They are the living testimony of the progress we have achieved, the new environment of serious study and pursuit of academic excellence that our College has brought to Raghampur.

On Tuesday February 20th, the Auditorium on the top floor of the new College building was blessed by the Superior, in time for a celebration of *Bhasa Diwas*, International Language day to remember our mother tongue, which will be fittingly remembered later in the day.

### Belgium Educational Sponsorship Programme

The workshop started at 10.30 a.m. at Human Resource Centre of PUS Baruipur. Fr. Parimal Kanji, the Director of PUS Baruipur welcomed, all the sponsored children and their parents and shared about the role & responsibility of parents and objective of Belgium Sponsorship Program. He also explained about the way how the Sponsor Committee Belgium raise fund for educational support to shape the future of our children. He further said that the school children in Belgium sacrifice their one day tiffin and contribute the money for the educational upliftment of the children from most backward community in India.

A drawing session was conducted for the sponsor children. The children were asked to draw some colourful pictures as per their own imagination; so that it can be sent to the supporters in Belgium as Easter greetings. Altogether 19 sponsored children and their parents were present at this workshop. The children being together from different communities and schools enjoyed the day.

concluded with thanks and gratitude followed by a tiffin packet to all the children and parents.

### Visit of Techno India Group University to Day Care Centre

Under the guidance of Prof. S. Dey Saha and other two faculty members a group of 20 engineering students of Techno India University visited PUS Day Care Centre (DCC) of Palli Unnayan Samiti Baruipur on 13th February 2018. The objective of visit was to provide an exposure to the students about Institutional care & therapy of children with disability as part of their study social work. Fr. Parimal Kanji, director of PUS welcomed the students with an introduction of DCC programme.



Jesmina Khatun, one of the DCC children who was not even able to walk few years before; performed a dance on the song "Momer Putul momer deshe neche jay" which touched their hearts. The students and faculty members had an interactive session with DCC children and their parents about their family background, problems faced, the service provided by DCC and its impacts.

The Techno India student presented a set of pastels colour and chocolate to each child as a gift. They



also showed an audio visual about the struggle and success of children with disability to encourage the DCC children. Prof. S. Dey said that it is a good service PUS is offering to the special children and promised to keep in touch with PUS to do something for the children of DCC.
