Resurrection of Jesus: The Foundation of Our Mission

The World In Darkness is a movie. The gist of the story is: An archaeologist finds a first century mummy in the tomb of Christ with similar description of Christ. The news papers across the globe splash the headlines calling resurrection of Christ as a fraud. Immediately the churches are destroyed, crosses are broken and Christians are persecuted. On his death bed, the archaeologist confesses that the whole thing is a joke, and the mummy was not genuine, it was faked by him.

Easter experience of the disciples began with an empty tomb. Even after assurances of the angel that he "has been raised", they walked away in disbelief and despair. Their faith seemed to be dead.

Only after they had seen the Risen Lord was their faith resurrected. Their fears turned into joy, their doubts into belief, their disappointments into hope. The confusion and fright that followed crucifixion gave in to conviction that Jesus was the messiah indeed. All that Jesus had been teaching them.

St. Paul writes: "Jesus... was put to death for our sins and raised to life to justify us" (Rom 4:25). Jesus "died and was raised to life" (2 Cor 5:15) for us that we might have eternal life. He now can share with us his divine life by releasing his Spirit of love so that we can know by a new knowledge how infinite God's love for us is as mirrored in Jesus' death on the cross.

The good news that pervades every page of the New Testament is that Jesus has died for love of us but is now risen and lives in us so that we, too, need never live under bondage of sin and death to God's life. We are capable of entering into his glorious, eternal

life by confessing our sins and living only for him as our Lord. He is the first fruits of the new creation. He is the new Adam who brings us a rebirth to new life through his Holy Spirit.

It was for no reason except his own compassion that he saved us, by means of the cleansing water of rebirth. Thus, he renewed us with the Holy Spirit whom he has so generously poured over us through Jesus Christ our savior to become heirs looking forward to inheriting eternal life (Tt 3:5-7).

St. Paul gives the title of Lord (Kyrios) to the risen Jesus to designate that, after his resurrection, Jesus is totally one with Yahweh. He is in glory and he exercises a royal sovereignty and dominion over the universe, by being inserted into matter in his spiritualized presence. Thus, he is reconciling the world to the Father by bringing it to its full completion. "He is the image of the unseen God and the first-born of all creation, for in him were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and everything invisible, Thrones, Dominations, Sovereignties, Powers all things were created through him and for him. Before anything was created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. Now the Church is his body, he is its head. As he is the beginning he was first to be born from the dead, so that he should be first in every way; because God wanted all perfection to be found in him and all things to be reconciled through him and for him, everything in heaven and everything on earth, when he made peace by his death on the cross" (Col 1:15-20).

News from Paribar Jyoti:

Social Workers Learn the Scientific Way of Helping People

"We social workers cannot be satisfied only by working for people's economic progress, closing our eyes to their suffering when they are weighed down by frustrations due to personal or family problems," said the participants who came to a 5-days counselling course held in Tehatta, Nadia district. They realised that giving advice does no good in most cases and sometimes it can be harmful. "We do not want to be professional counsellors, but we want to learn the process of helping people who have personal or family problems," they said. One of the things they discovered during the course was how mental conditions arising out of family situation affect personal wellbeing and the performance in the workplace. It was also explained to them that emotional debris left over from past incidents can clutter the mind and impede the mental process, destroying creativity, reducing the mental capacity and even causing psychosomatic diseases.



The 27 participants, mostly SHG supervisors and coordinators, felt satisfied

when they were able to do peer counselling with their companions and take it to the end of the helping process. Although it was a very short course they felt confident that with the skill they acquired they will be able to help their clients.

News from Raghabpur

Sunday, March 24th, 2019 was a truly memorable day for our people. Archbishop Thomas D'Souza presided over the Eucharistic celebration that morning. The occasion was twofold: the release of a new book on the veteran missionary Fr. Premananda Singha, son of the soil, the first priest of our Parish, whose unremitting labours in Olda, Kearchand, Kamarchowki, sowed the seeds of the Faith in the Midnapore Deanery. Further, the sacerdotal Golden Jubilees of Frs. Thottam, Augustine D'Souza, P.C. Matthew and Francis Koikara (all ordained in March 1959) were fondly remembered.

The book was conceived by Fr. Thottam during his ministry in Premananda Ashram, Chamrusai, and completed here with the able assistance of Ms. Sadhana Kairali, TIC of our school. It is, in the fullest sense, a labour of love, a personal insight into the life and legacy of Fr. Prem, an ordinary man with an extraordinary love for Christ, a man whose generosity and thirst should continue to be the programme of our lives today.

The Archbishop was brought in a procession to the Church, accompanied by the Jubilarians and a host of jubilant, kirtan singing parishioners. Two brothers of Fr.

Premananda and their families were with us, along with his niece Sr. Shikha DSA and a number of relatives. After the Mass, the book was released and the Jubiliarians felicitated. The Archbishop was very happy to see the school and nascent College and brought up-to-date on our history and ministry by Frs. Thottam and P.C. Matthew.

An even more joyful variety programme of Song, Dance, and Music in the evening at Kalahrdaya, in honour of our Jubiliarians, concluded a really memorable day in Raghabpur.
