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# **SHEPHERD'S VOICE**

#### **INTEGRITY**

How often we have said "Yes" for "No" and "No" for "yes"? Jesus, who said to his disciples "Follow me", indicated that they should be willing to follow his lifestyle. Later he instructed his disciples,

before commissioning them on their mission, 'your answer shall be "Yes" for yes and "No" for no and nothing more than that. It amounts to being truthful and sincere, leading a life of integrity. Therefore, an untruthful and insincere person without integrity cannot claim to follow the lifestyle of Jesus. Hence it goes without saying that any baptized person of that sort cannot claim to be a genuine Christian. Is it not true that Yahweh walked with Israel as long as they lived a life of integrity? They were doomed to face their own fate the moment they lost their integrity or truthfulness as the people of God. "Is this the sort of fast that pleases me.....Your integrity will go before you and the glory of the Lord behind you" (Is. 58/5-9). This is the commandment that the Lord sets before us. "Consecrate yourselves, therefore, and be holy, for I am holy" (Lev. 11:44).

The implications of this life-style are many: "you must not be partial to the little man nor overawed by the 'great'; you must pass your judgment on your neighbor according to justice; you must not slander your own people ......you must not bear hatred for your brother/sister in your heart ..... you must love your neighbor as yourself" (Lev. 19/14-18). Otherwise we will hear the voice of the Lord, "Woe to you, ....... You hypocrites .... You are like whitewashed tombs...." (Mt. 23: 23-28).

One sure help we look for, when we decide to live a life of integrity, is a person of that sort, whom we could model on to. Jesus presented us a model when he said, "Of all men born of women, he (John the Baptizer) is the greatest of all. John's genuine passion for his mission with an emphatic authentic life style made people doubt if he were the Messiah himself! In our

contemporary world, people like Mahatma Gandhi who explicitly reveals even his shadow side of life and the way he overcomes all the hurdles, searching for or experimenting with truth, could be another person we could adopt on our journey to 'life'. Nelson Mandela would be another one. The Church has attributed sainthood ("Being holy as the Heavenly Father is holy") to myriads of people proclaiming them as models. Hence, there is no dearth of models. The challenge is that each one of us is invited to be one of them! "Oh, that today you would hear his voice: 'Harden not your hearts' ...."

Given our human frailties and inner compulsions, one may wonder if it is an achievable goal at all. Remember, Saul could become St. Paul, despite inclinations to do what he in the heart of heart did not want to do. The secret is that he openly admitted his sinful ways (confession) and sought remedy for the same. Jesus himself had to face temptations till the last moment. The devil challenged him twice, "If you are son of God....." (Mt. 4: 3,6); and the third one was the offer to be the king of the world and the final one being, "If you are son of God, come down from the cross" (Mt. 27: 40). If the son of God was tempted with such tricks, where are we - fragile human beings? To be a person with integrity is certainly an achievable goal, provided we are ready to deny ourselves, take up our cross daily and follow him. This we do in a very intense form during the holy season of lent; and thereby we seek ways and means, proper to us, to bridge the gap between what we should be and what we really are.

"Jesus was authentic because there was consistency in what he taught and what he did, in how he lived" (Pope Francis). The harmonious existence of body, mind and soul is the recipe for the individual's integrity. If we have the courage to follow Jesus' footsteps, sure enough, we will have the required harmony and integrity in life, thereby becoming models for others.

### Priestly Ordination of Fr. M. Susai Raj

Raj, as he has been anointed a priest for Buxar diocese in his home parish of Muhaiyur (Pondichery, T.N.) on 3<sup>rd</sup> of January 2020, by the local ordinary, Most Rev. Neethinathan. **Fr. Susai Raj**, the youngest of the 7 children of Mr. R. Muthusavari and Late Antoniammal, is the 17<sup>th</sup> priest of Buxar diocese and the 61<sup>st</sup> priest from his parish! **Frs. James A., Anil Benet Cruz, Manoj Kumar and Christu Raj** CMF represented Buxar diocese at the ordination and the Thanks-giving Mass on the 4<sup>th</sup>. As a gesture of solidarity the four priests from Buxar put a shawl around the 'ordinandi' at the end of the First Mass, when the papal blessing also was read out.

### → CBCI

The XXXIV Plenary Assembly of CBCI took place on 13-19 Feb. 2020, 192 bishops attending, including **Bp. Sebastian K.** Its theme was DIALOGUE: The Path to Truth and Charity. Some points that emerged in the assembly were: Unity in diversity \* Dialogue with the poor, Dalits, Tribal people, nature, the

unborn\* D. of peace. The assembly in its Final Statement made a fervent appeal to all concerned to deal with nationalism, patriotism, totalitarianism etc. The authorities have to erase the sense of fear, anxiety etc. spreading in the country especially among the religious minorities. Dissent is not to be construed as unpatriotic. Democracy cannot be built on monologue.

The prelates said that they will take necessary disciplinary actions against offenders, irrespective of their standing in the Church. They agreed to "constitute mechanism with necessary infrastructure to redress cases of sexual abuse", leading to immediate relief for survivors.

### → Inauguration of New Centre

For the first time in history Holy Eucharist was celebrated at *Bhagawanpur* by Bp. Sebastian. **Fr. Thomas Vettu,** who moved in Jan. 2020 into a small priest's residence constructed in the four acre land

surrounded Kaimur hills, about 12 km away from Bhabua towards South, invited priests and religious especially from the deanery to join in the blessing cum inauguration of the Center (the 17<sup>th</sup> one). All those who went there fell in love with the place at the first sight. The occasion was marked by planting of saplings. The guests had to return with much reluctance, leaving Fr. Thomas in the hands of God and a dog, donated by Notre Dame sisters from Chenari, to guard him! Special gratitude to Fr. D. Amalan and Bro. Francis Lal, who were instrumental in the purchase of land and building the residence, not to mention the contacts made with the local people.

**Diocesan Priests National Congress held in Vailankanni** The Conference of the Diocesan Priests of India (CDPI) held its annual conference at

Vailankanni on 28-31 Jan. 2020. The participants were 700 in number representing Latin dioceses in

The role of diocesan priests in building up joyful communities 3. Diocesan priests and alternate ministries today.

CDPI began in 2001 and it was recognized as an association of diocesan priests in 2008 by CCBI and its revised statutes were finally approved in 2014. The objectives of CDPI are to strengthen the relationship by building up unity among priests and to deepen fraternity between bishops and priests, to continue ongoing formation in accordance with pastoral spirituality and signs of the time and to widen the pastoral bond among priests beyond the borders of the respective dioceses and create a web of mutual support in realizing the reign of God locally and in the universal church.

Along with 15 priests from Bihar Region Frs. Arogyaswamy Gotluri and Andrews Raja participated in the Conference.

It supports priests in adapting new ways of being ministers of the Church with alternate ministries.

Then there came the auspicious moment in the life of CCBI that the bishops awakened to the fact that it is imperative for the diocesan priests to have their own association! Thus CDPI (The Conference of Diocesan Priests of India) was born and every diocesan priest became an automatic member of the same. At present to a certain extend CDPI is doing what the CPCI is supposed to do. If my information is correct, the CPCI members are encouraged to be actively involved in CDPI. Some of them actively (true to their nature!) participated in the recently concluded CDPI Conference.

#### BUDSS: Recent Activities

From October 2019 the BUDSSS team was tirelessly working to make the small scale farmers of Chausa block in Buxar district to make their farm cultivation more productive and nutritional. They have formed themselves in to Farmer Groups, registered as *Khadya Suraksha Samuhs* for women farmers and *Hritak Kisan Samuhs* for Men farmers. Thus, we have 41 such farmer groups in 20 villages of the above mentioned Chausa block. The members of these groups are getting different kinds of training on organic farming, the importance of soil testing, seed selection, seed banks, kitchen garden, organic fertilizer, organic pesticides, farmer clubs, farmer

production organizations, and organic food production cum supply centers. To support the farmers we had an Exposure Programme for one farmer each from all 41 groups in Gorakhpur DSS. By such an exposure all the farmers, including the Saksham team of BUDSSS, were inspired and energized to continue their many initiatives in agricultural field with more commitment and dedication. We also appreciate the warm welcome we received at PGSS (Purvanchal Gramin Sewa Samiti, Gorakhpur under the Leadership of Fr. Jaison.

The same with our village animators/ teachers of 37 NFE centers in *Musahartolas* with another exposure programme to Madhubani Social Center (PRABHAT, Sakri). Here, too, the teachers from Rajpur and Itarhi blocks and Dhansoi area of ICM sisters, of Buxar district along with Kargahar block of Rohtas district, Kudra block of Kaimur district were inspired and encouraged to continue their commitment and dedication to educate and organize the *Musahar* communities of these areas to a better socio-economic and political development. 37 teachers, 6 Supervisors and two coordinators and two of our office staff with Fr. Manoj and Sudeep made this team to PRABHAT, Sakri, and Madhubani. All of them were extremely happy to learn that the *Musahar* communities are going ahead with the assistance and direction of **Prabhat** Staff. We also appreciate the warm welcome we received from Sakri under the leadership of Frs. Anand and Jose Vadassery.

Over the last six months we were also able to organize awareness programmes in 6 villages, on issues like Cleanliness, Organic farming, Forestation, Earth Day etc.

#### Did You Know?

- India is listed among top 10 countries of anti-Christian violence. 29 missionaries were killed worldwide in 2019 (Fides). Christians faced 1,774 hate crimes in four years.
- Catholic population of S. Korea grows by 50% in 20 years.
- Indian Diaspora, the largest in the world (17.5 million: UN).
- ➤ Pope Francis: "So many people live without knowing what goes on in their hearts"
- ➤ Shanti Sadan, a three-storey building in Benaulim, Goa will be the new Secretariat Extension of CCBI. The commissions for Liturgy and Family will operate from there. The other Secretariat buildings are: 1. Proclamation, Pachmarhi (MP) 2. Youth, Bethania (Faridabad) 3. PMO, Ulsoor (Bangalore) 4. Headquarters, CCBI Centre (Bangalore).
- The Dicastery of the Laity, the Family and Life is to organize the first International Congress of Pastoral Ministry of the Elderly at the request of the Holy Father.

- Red Wednesday' campaign has become an official Church celebration in Philippines. It is promoted by the Church in Need (ACN) to encourage people to stand up for religious freedom.

- Frame Stains and his two sons Philip (10) and Timothy (6) were remembered on January 23, the 21<sup>st</sup> anniversary of their martyrdom –burnt alive. With the cancerous growth of hate crimes against the religious minorities, our Mother Land continues to be bathed in the blood of her children.
- Reprehensible mass kidnapping has become very common in Nigeria. In January 2020 four seminarians and in March one priest have been kidnapped.
- North Korea received the number one spot for the 18<sup>th</sup> consecutive year as the hardest place in the world to be a Christian. China is the 23<sup>rd</sup> and India the 10<sup>th</sup> in the list. Christianity is on the verge of extinction in Iraq and Syria. China has been building a "blueprint for persecution". (World Watch List 2020)
- On the initiative of the Dicastery for the Laity, the Family and Life, some 550 experts and pastoral agents from 60 countries will gather in Rome to reflect and find answers to: What has the Church to say in the face of "revolution of longevity"?
- Twenty nine missionaries (6 laymen, 2 women religious, 2 men religious, one permanent deacon and 18 priests have been killed in the year 2019 in the world over)
- First woman: Pope Francis elevated Dr. Fransesca Di Giovanni (66), an undersecretary for multilateral affairs in the Vatican Secretariat of State to a managerial position on January 15,2020.
- The 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the declaration of Rome as the capital of Italy to take place in 2025. It is to be an ordinary Jubilee.
