#### I. ARCHBISHOP'S MESSAGE

Joys of the children of God the Father in Christ Jesus His Eternal Son, to one and all of you during this Easter season!

What is this Easter joy with which the obedient children of God the Father are quite overwhelmingly filled in their inner natures through the Holy Spirit? St. Peter answers this question for us in the most sublime manner: 'Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls (1 Peter 1:8-9).' St. Paul too explains the nature of this Easter joy in a more focused manner to the faithful of the Church in Rome: 'The kingdom of God is not food and drink but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit (Rom.14:17).' It is a joy which is not only unknown but also, quite tragically, incomprehensible to all those whose 'minds are set on earthly things' and 'whose god is the belly' and 'live as enemies of the cross of Christ' and 'whose end is destruction(Phil3:18-19).' It is the joy of all those who have purposefully renewed their baptismal promises to persevere in their daily participation of the faith of the Son our Lord Jesus Christ expressing itself in works of divine charity and imbued with true fear of God and the supernatural virtue of hope in order 'to attain the resurrection from the dead (Phil.3:11). In sum, it is the abiding joy that the Son our Lord Jesus Christ Himself perennially gives to His faithful ones through His Holy Spirit to assure them that 'their citizenship is in heaven' from where they are 'expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ,' who 'will transform their lowly bodies to the likeness of His own glorious body' by the power 'that enables Him to make all things subject to Himself (Phil.3:20-21).'

'Deliver us Lord from every evil, grant us peace in our day, and in Your mercy keep us free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour Jesus Christ!'

## II. MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR THE 53<sup>rd</sup> WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY

« "We are members one of another" (Eph4,25). From social network communities to the human community »

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Ever since the internet first became available, the Church has always sought to promote its use in the service of the encounter between persons, and of solidarity among all. With this Message I would like to invite you once again to reflect on the foundation and importance of our being-in-relation and to rediscover, in the vast array of challenges of the current communications context, the desire of the human person who does not want to be left isolated and alone.

#### The metaphors of the net and community

Today's media environment is so pervasive as to be indistinguishable from the sphere of everyday life. The Net is a resource of our time. It is a source of knowledge and relationships that were once unthinkable. However, in terms of the profound transformations technology has brought to bear on the process of production, distribution and use of content, many experts also highlight the risks that threaten the search for, and sharing of, authentic information on a global scale. If the Internet represents an extraordinary possibility of access to knowledge, it is also true that it has proven to be one of the areas most exposed to disinformation and to the conscious and targeted distortion of facts and interpersonal relationships, which are often used to discredit.

We need to recognize how social networks, on the one hand, help us to better connect, rediscover, and assist one another, but on the other, lend themselves to the manipulation of personal data, aimed at obtaining political or economic advantages, without due respect for the person and his or her rights. Statistics show that among young people one in four is involved in episodes of cyberbullying.[1]

In this complex scenario, it may be useful to reflect again on the metaphor of the net, which was the basis of the Internet to begin with, to rediscover its positive potential. The image of the net invites us to reflect on the multiplicity of lines and intersections that ensure its stability in the absence of a centre, a hierarchical structure, a form of vertical organization. The net works because all its elements share responsibility. From an anthropological point of view, the metaphor of the net recalls another meaningful image: the community. A community is that much stronger if it is cohesive and supportive, if it is animated by feelings of trust, and pursues common objectives. The community as a network of solidarity requires mutual listening and dialogue, based on the responsible use of language.

Everyone can see how, in the present scenario, social network communities are not automatically synonymous with community. In the best cases, these virtual communities are able to demonstrate cohesion and solidarity, but often they remain simply groups of individuals who recognize one another through common interests or concerns characterized by weak bonds. Moreover, in the social web identity is too often based on opposition to the other, the person outside the group: we define ourselves starting with what divides us rather than with what unites us, giving rise to suspicion and to the venting of every kind of prejudice (ethnic, sexual, religious and other). This tendency encourages groups that exclude diversity, that even in the digital environment nourish unbridled individualism which sometimes ends up fomenting spirals of hatred. In this way, what ought to be a window on the world becomes a showcase for exhibiting personal narcissism.

The Net is an opportunity to promote encounter with others, but it can also increase our self-isolation, like a web that can entrap us. Young people are the ones most exposed to the illusion that the social web can completely satisfy them on a relational level. There is the dangerous phenomenon of young people becoming "social hermits" who risk alienating themselves completely from society. This dramatic situation reveals a serious rupture in the relational fabric of society, one we cannot ignore. This multiform and dangerous reality raises various questions of an ethical, social, juridical, political and economic nature, and challenges the Church as well. While governments seek legal ways to regulate the web and to protect the original vision of a free, open and secure network, we all have the possibility and the responsibility to promote its positive use.

Clearly, it is not enough to multiply connections in order to increase mutual understanding. How, then, can we find our true communitarian identity, aware of the responsibility we have towards one another in the online network as well?

#### WE ARE MEMBERS ONE OF ANOTHER

A possible answer can be drawn from a third metaphor: that of the body and the members, which Saint Paul uses to describe the reciprocal relationship among people, based on the organism that unites them. "Therefore, putting away falsehood,

speak the truth, each to his neighbour, for we are members one of another" (Eph 4:25). Being members one of another is the profound motivation with which the Apostle invites us to put away falsehood and speak the truth: the duty to guard the truth springs from the need not to belie the mutual relationship of communion. Truth is revealed in communion. Lies, on the other hand, are a selfish refusal to recognize that we are members of one body; they are a refusal to give ourselves to others, thus losing the only way to find ourselves.

The metaphor of the body and the members leads us to reflect on our identity, which is based on communion and on "otherness". As Christians, we all recognize ourselves as members of the one body whose head is Christ. This helps us not to see people as potential competitors, but to consider even our enemies as persons. We no longer need an adversary in order to define ourselves, because the allencompassing gaze we learn from Christ leads us to discover otherness in a new way, as an integral part and condition of relationship and closeness.

Such a capacity for understanding and communication among human persons is based on the communion of love among the divine Persons. God is not Solitude, but Communion; he is Love, and therefore communication, because love always communicates; indeed, it communicates itself in order to encounter the other. In order to communicate with us and to communicate himself to us, God adapts himself to our language, establishing a real dialogue with humanity throughout history (cf. Second Vatican Ecumenical Council, Dogmatic Constitution Dei Verbum, 2)....

## 3. The Conclusions arrived-at, TCBC Ordinary Meeting held on: 28<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2019 at St. John's Regional Seminary, Ramanthapur, Hyderabad - 13.

#### I. Regarding TCBC Regional Bodies

#### A. Amruthavani Communications Centre

- 1. The Term of Office of the Director of Amruthavani has been extended until June 2020 after which he has to handover the charge to his successor.
- 2. The Administrator of Amruthavani will be the custodian of all Legal Documents, Society Registration Papers and all relevant Documents with regard to Amruthavani Communications Centre.
- 3. The Administrator of Amruthavani, will continue attending to the legal cases; of widow's Quarters, Tenant legal cases and matters pertaining to the Administration of Amruthavani.
- 4. Rev.Fr. P. Mariadas, as the Administrator of Amruthavani, will handle 'SIGNIS' project and other similar projects from the funds allotted by TCBC at the discretion of the Chairman and the consent & approval of the Executive Body with information to the General Body of Amruthavani Communications Society.
- 5. The Administrator of Amruthavani is authorised by TCBC to operate Amruthavani Website, use Postal Stationary and has access to Amruthavani Post Office Box etc...

#### B. Divyavani Social Communications Company (Telugu Catholic T.V. Channel)

- 1. The TCBC has strongly recommended to the Chairman of Amruthavani to prepare & train priests to take over the charge of Divyavani, in immediate future.
- 2. The Members of TCBC are unanimous in advising the Director & Administrator of Amruthavani to strictly comply with the decisions & directions of TCBC

#### II. Regarding TCBC Regional Commissions

1. The Members were unanimous in expressing that the Concessions slab in Educational Institutions, should be revised as the people whose income is

- below Rs 1,00,000/-may not benefit much from the existing slab system
- 2. The Members stressed the need to organise a Regional Consultation on Dalit Policy to develop a Policy for Telugu Region
- 3. It was reiterated that the Episcopal Churches (including the Roman Catholic Church) are authorised/permitted, as per the Law of Christian Marriages, to solemnise Christian Marriages
- 4. It is advised that each couple, after getting married in the Church, should go to the Registrar Office and get notified of their marriage in the Register.
- 5. The Official Book of Blessings published by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments should be translated into Telugu language.

#### **III. Matters of Regional Seminaries**

#### A. St. Paul's Regional Seminary, Nuzvid- (A.P.)

1. The TCBC expressed that more concentration should be on spoken English as many students join the Seminary from Telugu Medium Background. If needed, some experts from outside, Should be invited to conduct coaching classes at regular intervals.

#### B. St. John's Regional Seminary, Kondadaba- Kothavalasa. (A.P.)

#### 1. I HAVE CALLED YOU BY NAME, YOU ARE MINE - Is. 43:1

23<sup>rd</sup> April 2019, 5 PM, witnessed an impeccable occasion with the altar in the ground of St. Mary's Church beautifully decorated in red and gold. The ground shone with a host of holy priests, religious and the Laity who gathered to celebrate the Priestly Ordination of 2 young and holy men of God Fr. Jerome Emmanuel Lewis (belonging to St. John Maria Vianney Parish, New Bhoiguda, Secunderabad) and Fr. Yeruva Bala Sudhir (belonging to St. Ignatius Church, Gagilapuram). Amidst great shock and grief of the loss of lives in Srilanka on Easter, there rose another 2 young lives that dedicated themselves to the Lord of all life with their motto: Called to Serve, To spread the Good News of Christ.

As the priests of the dioceses walked through the crowd towards the altar the Choir Sang with the angelic hosts of heaven that resonated in the hearts of the faithful. On this solemn occasion the families of the candidates were with them as they offered their sons to the Lord's vineyard. It was so beautiful to witness the intimacy these young men have inculcated in themselves towards their beloved Creator that so willingly and enthusiastically they have worked hard towards accepting their call to holy priesthood.

His Grace Arch Bishop Thumma Bala conferred on the young candidates the sacrament of Holy Priesthood during the methodical ceremony that went on in an orderly manner as Rev. Fr. M. Anthony led the faithful in understanding the ceremony and praying for the priests through his clear compeering. The Gospel was read by Rev. Fr. Jerome Emmanuel Lewis in Telugu.

The third part of the Ceremony began with Calling of the Candidates. As they came forward, candidates were Presented by Rev. Msgnr. Swarna Bernard before the Arch Bishop who was seated in the holy seat. After the Election of the Candidates, His Grace bishop Thumma Bala very beautifully shared the Word of God that stirred the heart of everyone present there and the priests in particular that led them to retrospect and contemplate on the purpose of their call to this holy life and their faithfulness towards it. With the 5 essentials a priest must have

he explained the significance of Holiness (Parishudhatha), Prayer life (Prarthana jeevitham), being an people's man (Prajala manishi) along with being humble and obedient to the Lord in any given circumstance. It was so admirable for a person of such great honor speaking so unswervingly and out rightly to his counterparts and encouraging them to pray at all times. "The primary duty of every priest is to serve the people by celebrating the holy mass and administering the sacraments diligently. Everything else is secondary"... he said.

The Examination of the Candidate, approval from their authorities was followed by Promise of Obedience, and Invitation to Prayer. As the candidates laid prostrate before the Altar as a sign of total submission the whole congregation knelt down to intercede for them with the Litany of Saints. Thereafter, the holy priests blessed the candidates by Laying of Hands as they knelt facing the altar. His Grace prayed the Prayer of Consecration seeking the Lord's blessing and strength to live a holy and consecrated life. The Investiture began with placing the Stole (that was so long placed on the right shoulder alone depicting their life as a deacon),on both the shoulders depicting the duty as a priest and prophet. After the Chasuble was worn, the Anointing of Hands with the Chrism oil was a reminder again that this is an everlasting covenant, "once a priest is a priest forever". This calling cannot be revoked. The Archbishop wished the new priests with the Presentation of the Gifts and the Kiss of peace.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist continued forward with offertory procession by the family members and consecration and Holy Communion. A minute's silence and special prayer was offered for the victims of the Srilanka bomb blast. The Concluding Rite included the Concluding Prayer, Final Blessing followed by Vote of Thanks by Rev. Fr. Yeruva Bala Sudhir who so meticulously mentioned every person and group responsible for the day to happen without forgetting anyone. The Celebration ended with Felicitation, group photo and Dinner for all.

Indeed it was an amazing sight to witness as the people thronged to kiss the newly anointed hands of the holy priests who so lovingly wished, thanked, recognized and expressed their gratitude to everyone specially their school teachers who came all the way to grace this occasion.
