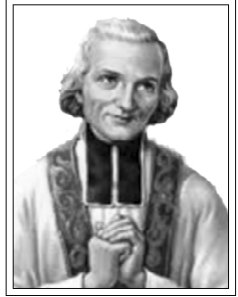

ST. JOHN VIANNEY AND THE POWER OF PRAYER

"I'm ready for a change – I want to [surrender my life to God] like you . . . how do I start?"

The man who spoke these words couldn't have reached his 40s yet, but his searching gaze looked as if those eyes had seen a lifetime of futility. "If the Lord does not build the house, in vain does the builder labor. If the Lord does not watch over the city, in vain do the watchmen keep vigil. In vain is your earlier rising; your going later to rest when the Lord pours gifts on His beloved while they slumber." So runs psalm 127, whose words immediately came to mind. The man was lacking not human effort or will, but the grace of God and an openness to receive it to allow it to change his life. As for his question, "how do I start," St. John Vianney can point out the answer: prayer.



"Prayer is to our soul what rain is to the soil. Fertilize the soil ever so richly, it will remain barren unless fed by frequent rains."

St. John Vianney knew first hand of long-term struggles in life and the importance of prayer as the means of lifting to God his personal problems along with all his efforts to overcome them. Not a natural scholar, he struggled with the studies needed to become ordained. When these were interrupted by Napoleonic wars and being drafted into the army (at least twice), it only became harder to return and complete them. Yet it was surely his constancy in prayer that transformed all his hardships into sources of sanctity.

Prayer – lifting the heart to God and entering into communion with Him – is meant for every one of us. Regular prayer was Jesus' own habit, as we see in today's gospel: "[Jesus] went up on the mountain by himself to pray" (Mt 14:23). We can see also the role that an area of calm solitude plays – Jesus deliberately dismisses everyone, even His disciples, and goes off by Himself. In the midst of our very interconnected lives, such a place of peace and quiet may seem impossible to achieve. This atmosphere of quiet reverence is readily

found closer than we think – churches, chapels, and even a small corner of our living quarters can easily lend themselves to this holy silence in which to pray. Once we climb away from the busy-ness of life, particularly from information traffic flow – shutting off our cell phone and computers – once we deliberately suspend our concerns for whatever work or projects clamor for attention on our to-do list, then we are ready to communicate with God.

Once we begin to speak with (and especially listen to) God, we can directly share with Him all that we are struggling with and all that we find joy and gratitude in. **St. John Vianney reminds us that in prayer we receive what we need to strengthen us as well as the joy of knowing that we are united with God: “Man has a beautiful office, that of praying and loving. You pray, you love – that is the happiness of man upon the earth. Prayer is nothing else than union with God. When our heart is pure and united to God, we feel within ourselves a joy, a sweetness that inebriates, a light that dazzles us.”** Connecting to God in prayer establishes a lifeline through which His grace can reach us, sooth our fears, and divinely supplement our own human nature so as to turn our lives completely towards God.

SAINT JOHN VIANNEY’S PRAYER To JESUS

I love You, O my God, and my only desire is to love You until the last breath of my life.

I love You, O my infinitely lovable God,
and I would rather die loving You, than live without loving You.
I love You, Lord, and the only grace I ask is to love You eternally
My God, if my tongue cannot say in every moment that I love You,
I want my heart to repeat it to You as often as I draw breath.

7 Quotes from St. John Vianney on the Sanctification of Daily Life

1. “In your work, offer your difficulties and troubles quite simply to God...and you will find that His blessing will rest upon you and on all you do.”

2. "Receive, O my God, all my thoughts and all I am going to do today, in union with all You bore out of love for me during Your life on earth."
3. "When we do something we dislike, let us say to God: 'My God, I offer you this in honor of the moment when you died for me.'"
4. "OH! How easily we could win Heaven day by day just by doing what we have to do – but *by doing it for God!...*"
5. "Do not try to please everybody. Try to please God, the Angels, and the Saints – *they* are your public."
6. "When we cannot come to church, let us turn towards the Tabernacle and make a spiritual Communion. A wall cannot separate us from God."
7. "Those who go often to Mass during the week, do their work very much better than those who, for want of faith, think they have no time for it."

O, St. John Vianney, you endured daily struggles as the Priest of Ars, but through daily prayer and sanctification brought many souls to Jesus Christ. Intercede for us daily and assist us in sanctifying our day, so that we, through your guidance may bring those we encounter on a daily basis closer to Jesus Christ and His Catholic Church. Amen.

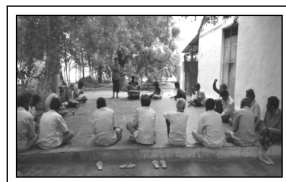

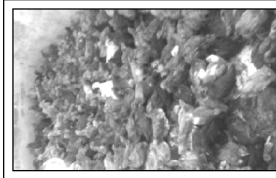

PIME'S Fr Rayarala Vijay Kumar is the new **Bishop of Srikakulam**

Your Eminence, Your Beatitude, Your Excellency, Your Grace, Your Lordship,

In the light of the Communication received from the Apostolic Nunciature, I wish to inform you that His Holiness, Pope Francis has appointed Rev. Fr. Vijaya Kumar Rayarala, P.I.M.E., Regional Superior of the P.I.M.E. as Bishop of the Diocese of Srikakulam.



This provision was made public in Rome on Tuesday, 16th July, 2019, at noon, corresponding to 15:30 hours, Indian Standard Time.

Rev. Fr. Vijaya Kumar Rayarala, P.I.M.E., was born in Khammam, on 15th October, 1969. He joined *St. John's Minor Seminary*, Nidadavolu, Eluru and then studied Philosophy at *Jnana Deep Vidyapeeth*, Pune. He continued his studies of Theology and Spirituality in the International Theologate of *Pontificio Istituto Missioni Estere* (P.I.M.E.) in Monza (Italy) and made his final profession in the P.I.M.E. on 1st October, 1997. He was ordained priest in the Cathedral of Khammam, on 29th August, 1998. In 2003 he obtained a Licentiate in Biblical Theology from *San Luigi University*, Naples (Italy).

He served P.I.M.E. in the following ministries:

1998-2000: Vocations Animator, St. Xavier's Institutions, Eluru;

2003-2006: Parish Priest, *Woodlark, Alotau*, Papua New Guinee;

2006-2008: Associate Director, Lepers' Rehabilitation Centre, Bombay;

2008-2014: Director, Lepers' Rehabilitation Centre, Bombay;

Since 2014: Regional Superior, P.I.M.E.

‘Pray for the Reception of Victims of Trafficking,’ Says Pope Francis in the Preface to the Book ‘Crucified Women: The Shame of Trafficking Told from the Street’

After hearing the story of the women freed from prostitution and sheltered in the John XXIII House, Pope Francis felt “almost the need to ask forgiveness for the real tortures they had to endure, caused by the clients, many of whom say they are Christians. A further impulse to pray for the reception of the victims of trafficking of forced prostitution and violence.”

The Holy Father wrote the Preface of the book entitled: “Crucified Women: The Shame of Trafficking Told from the Street” (Rubbettino), by Father Aldo Buonaiuto, priest of the Pope John XXIII Community.

Pope John XXIII Community

The Pope John XXIII Community Association is an international organization of faithful of pontifical right. Father Oreste Benzi founded the Community in 1968. Since then, it is specifically and continually committed to the fight against marginalization and poverty.

In a press release published on the occasion of the book’s going on sale, Giovanni Paolo Ramonda, the Community’s President, said that the battle against prostitution was started by Father Oreste Benzi 30 years ago when he met a prostitute in the Rimini station and learned about the abuse that prostitution entails.

This battle has continued to our days, with more than 100 volunteers of the Pope John XXIII Community, who every week go out into the streets to try to liberate these women.

On one of the Fridays of Mercy, during the Extraordinary Holy Year, when I entered the House of the Pope John XXIII Community, I did not think I would meet inside there such humiliated, afflicted and exhausted women — really crucified women. In the room, where I met with girls liberated from the trafficking of forced prostitution, I breathed all the pain, the injustice and the effect of oppression — an opportunity to relive Christ’s wounds. After listening to the moving and very human stories of these poor women, some of them with their child in their arms, I felt a strong desire, almost the necessity to ask forgiveness for

the real tortures they had to endure caused by the clients, many of whom describe themselves as Christians — a further impulse to pray for the reception of the victims of trafficking of forced prostitution and violence.

A person can never be put on sale. Therefore, I am happy to be able to make known the precious and courageous work of rescue and rehabilitation, which Father Aldo Buonaiuto has been doing for many years, following Oreste Benzi's charism. This also implies the will to expose oneself to the dangers and reprisals of the crime, which has made of these girls an inexhaustible source of illicit and shameful earnings.

I would like this book to be heard in the widest ambit possible so that, knowing the stories that exist behind the scandalous numbers of trafficking, it can be understood that without stopping the very high demand of clients, the exploitation and humiliation of innocent lives will not be able to be checked.

Corruption is an illness that doesn't stop on its own. There must be awareness at the individual and collective level, also as Church, to really help these unfortunate sisters of ours and to impede the world's iniquity falling on the most fragile and vulnerable creatures. Any form of prostitution is a reduction to slavery, a criminal act, a repugnant vice that confuses making love with venting one's instincts by torturing a defenseless woman.

It is a wound to the collective conscience, a deviation from the current imaginary. The mentality is pathological by which a woman must be exploited as if she were merchandise to be used and then discarded. It is an illness of humanity, an erroneous way of thinking of society. To free these poor slaves is a gesture of mercy and a duty for all men of goodwill. Their cry of pain cannot leave individuals or institutions indifferent. No one must look the other way or wash his hands of the innocent blood that is shed in the roads of the world.
