MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR LENT 2020

“We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God” (2 Cor 5:20)

Dear Brothers and Sisters, This year the Lord grants us, once again, a favourable time to prepare to celebrate with renewed hearts the great mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus, the cornerstone of our personal and communal Christian life. We must continually return to this mystery in mind and heart, for it will continue to grow within us in the measure that we are open to its spiritual power and respond with freedom and generosity.

1. The paschal mystery as the basis of conversion Christian joy flows from listening to, and accepting, the Good News of the death and resurrection of Jesus. This kerygma sums up the mystery of a love “so real, so true, so concrete, that it invites us to a relationship of openness and fruitful dialogue” (Christus Vivit, 117). Whoever believes this message rejects the lie that our life is ours to do with as we will. Rather, life is born of the love of God our Father, from his desire to grant us life in abundance (cf. Jn 10:10). If we listen instead to the tempting voice of the “father of lies” (Jn 8:44), we risk sinking into the abyss of absurdity, and experiencing hell here on earth, as all too many tragic events in the personal and collective human experience sadly bear witness. In this Lent of 2020, I would like to share with every Christian what I wrote to young people in the Apostolic Exhortation Christus Vivit: “Keep your eyes fixed on the outstretched arms of Christ crucified, let yourself be saved over and over again. And when you go to confess your sins, believe firmly in his mercy which frees you of your guilt. Contemplate his blood poured out with such great love, and let yourself be cleansed by it. In this way, you can be reborn ever anew” (No. 123). Jesus’ Pasch is not a past event; rather, through the power of the Holy Spirit it is ever present, enabling us to see and touch with faith the flesh of Christ in those who suffer.

2. The urgency of conversion It is good to contemplate more deeply the paschal mystery through which God's mercy has been bestowed upon us. Indeed, the experience of mercy is only possible in a "face to face" relationship with the crucified and risen Lord "who loved me and gave himself for me" (Gal 2:20), in a heartfelt dialogue between friends. That is why prayer is so important in Lent. Even more than a duty, prayer is an expression of our need to respond to God's love which always precedes and sustains us. Christians pray in the knowledge that, although unworthy, we are still loved. Prayer can take any number of different forms, but what truly matters in God's eyes is that it penetrates deep within us and chips away at our hardness of heart, in order to convert us ever more fully to God and to his will. In this favourable season, then, may we allow ourselves to be led like Israel into the desert (cf. Hos 2:14), so that we can at last hear our Spouse's voice and allow it to resound ever more deeply within us. The more fully we are engaged with his word, the more we will experience the mercy he freely gives us. May we not let this time of grace pass in vain, in the foolish illusion that we can control the times and means of our conversion to him.

3. God's passionate will to dialogue with his children The fact that the Lord once again offers us a favourable time for our conversion should never be taken for granted. This new opportunity ought to awaken in us a sense of gratitude and stir us from our sloth. Despite the sometimes tragic presence of evil in our lives, and in the life of the Church and the world, this opportunity to change our course expresses God's unwavering will not to interrupt his dialogue of salvation with us. In the crucified Jesus, who knew no sin, yet for our sake was made to be sin (cf. 2 Cor 5:21), this saving will led the Father to burden his Son with the weight of our sins, thus, in the expression of Pope Benedict XVI, "turning God against himself" (*Deus Caritas Est*, 12). For God also loves his enemies (cf. Mt 5:43-48). The dialogue that God wishes to establish with each of us through the paschal mystery of his Son has nothing to do with empty chatter, like that attributed to the ancient inhabitants of Athens, who "spent their time in nothing except

telling or hearing something new” (Acts 17:21). Such chatter, determined by an empty and superficial curiosity, characterizes worldliness in every age; in our own day, it can also result in improper use of the media.

4. A richness to be shared, not kept for oneself Putting the paschal mystery at the centre of our lives means feeling compassion towards the wounds of the crucified Christ present in the many innocent victims of wars, in attacks on life, from that of the unborn to that of the elderly, and various forms of violence. They are likewise present in environmental disasters, the unequal distribution of the earth’s goods,

human trafficking in all its forms, and the unbridled thirst for profit, which is a form of idolatry. Today too, there is a need to appeal to men and women of good will to share, by almsgiving, their goods with those most in need, as a means of personally participating in the building of a better world. Charitable giving makes us more human, whereas hoarding risks making us less human, imprisoned by our own selfishness. We can and must go even further, and consider the structural aspects of our economic life. For this reason, in the midst of Lent this year, from 26 to 28 March, I have convened a meeting in Assisi with young economists, entrepreneurs and change-makers, with the aim of shaping a more just and inclusive economy. As the Church’s magisterium has often repeated, political life represents an eminent form of charity (cf. Pius XI, Address to the Italian Federation of Catholic University Students, 18 December 1927). The same holds true for economic life, which can be approached in the same evangelical spirit, the spirit of the Beatitudes. I ask Mary Most Holy to pray that our Lenten celebration will open our hearts to hear God’s call to be reconciled to himself, to fix our gaze on the paschal mystery, and to be converted to an open and sincere dialogue with him. In this way, we will become what Christ asks his disciples to be: the salt of the earth and the light of the world (cf. Mt 5:13-14).

3. Missionary Holy Childhood Sunday on 9th February 2020:

"Children are our present rather than the future: it is in our care to make them experience the joy, prayer and sharing even in difficulties. And with a truly universal spirit: I would like to remind you that, during the earthquake in central Italy, children in the Central African Republic, a very poor country, gave up a meal to help their peers affected": says Sister Roberta Tremarelli to Agenzia Fides, Secretary General of the Pontifical Missionary Childhood Society - one of the four Pontifical Mission Societies - on the eve of 6 January, solemnity of the Epiphany, where in many countries of the world special Missionary Childhood Day or Missionary Day of Children is celebrated.

The religious explains to Fides: "Missionary Childhood Day is born with the purpose of having a specific day during the year in which children in all the countries of the world are involved in a special way. It is celebrated in different periods and forms, according to the calendar and the contexts, with the aim of educating them to the missionary spirit of attention towards other children, through prayer, offerings and sharing".

3. Ash Wednesday on 26th February 2020:

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the season of Lent. This year begins the season of Grace on 26th February, 2020. It is a season of fasting, prayer and almsgiving which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection.

Ash Wednesday marks the onset of the Lent, the 40 days period of fasting and abstinence. It is also known as the "Day of Ashes". So called because on that day at Church the faithful have their foreheads marked with ashes in the shape of a cross.

Putting a 'cross' mark on the forehead was in imitation of the spiritual mark or seal that is put on a Christian in baptism. This is when the newly born Christian is delivered from slavery to sin and the devil, and made a slave of righteousness and Christ (Rom. 6:3-18).

This can also be held as an adoption of the way 'righteousness' are described in the book of Revelation, where we come to know about the servants of God. The reference to the sealing of the servants of God for their protection in Revelation is an allusion to a parallel passage in Ezekiel, where Ezekiel also sees a sealing of the servants of God for their protection.

**CARDINAL TAGLE IS THE
NEW PREFECT OF PROPAGANDA FIDE**

The Cardinal Archbishop of Manila, Luis Antonio Tagle is the new Prefect of the Congregation for the Evangelization of Peoples. The appointment by Pope Francis was announced on Sunday 8 December. The current Prefect, Cardinal Fernando Filoni, assumes the post of Grand Master of the Order of the Holy Sepulcher in place of Cardinal Edwin Frederick O'Brien, who resigned in April 2019 and turned 80.

Luis Antonio Gokim Tagle was born on 21 June 1957 in Manila to a Catholic family - his father of Tagalog ethnicity and his mother of Chinese origin - and was ordained priest in 1982. He studied in the United States where he obtained his doctorate in theology with a thesis on the evolution of the notion of episcopal collegiality since the Second Vatican Council. He

spent seven years in Rome to deepen his studies and in 1997 joined the International Theological Commission.

After serving as parish priest at the Cathedral of Imus, at the age of 44 he was consecrated bishop of that diocese by Saint John Paul II in October 2001. He dedicated himself in particular to youth ministry and inaugurated the first meeting of young Asians in Imus. On 13 October 2011 Pope Benedict XVI appointed him Metropolitan Archbishop of Manila and made him a cardinal thirteen months later, in November 2012. In addition to leading the Manila Archdiocese, Cardinal Tagle is President of Caritas Internationalis and the Catholic Biblical Federation. With this choice, announced a few days after the end of his trip to Thailand and Japan, Pope Francis once again shows great attention to the Asian continent. With the designation of Cardinal Tagle, which follows a few weeks after that of Spanish Jesuit Juan Antonio Guerrero Alves as Prefect of the Secretariat for the Economy, two new heads of department will be installed at the beginning of 2020 in the Roman Curia.

COMMUNICATION ON LENTEN CAMPAIGN 2020

Greetings from Caritas India!

During the last year's Lenten Season, Caritas India had made concerted efforts to actively promote the Lenten Campaign across the country. As an immediate fruit of this efforts, 69 Dioceses had the official Diocesan launch of the Lenten Campaign by the respective Archbishops and Bishops and 7 States had State level launch of the Lenten Campaign on one of the Sundays of Lent in the year 2019. This also helped in sensitizing the Church community on the Campaign against **"Hunger and Disease"**.

I also recall with gratitude the decision taken by CBCI's Standing Committee in its May 2019 Meeting that all the Catholic Dioceses of our country will officially launch Caritas India's Lenten Campaign on the 1st Sunday of Lent every year.

In preparation for the Lenten Campaign 2020, Caritas India has made concrete plans to take forward the Lenten Campaign more extensively and

fruitfully. Hence, this year, the Management and all the Staff of Caritas India and the Directors of the Regional Fora will assist the Diocesan Directors of Social Apostolate to plan the Lenten Campaign launch by the Archbishops and Bishops in their respective Dioceses. In this regard, the Management and the Staff of Caritas India and the Regional Forum Directors will personally visit different Dioceses to be part of the Campaign launch.

Caritas India wishes to reach out to as many parishioners as possible with the Message of this year's theme for the Lenten Campaign – **Sustain Life: Sustainable Livelihood**. Caritas India would be sending the promotional materials of the Lenten Campaign to each Diocese/Diocesan Social Service Society. We have also prepared the Lenten Liturgy Booklet with Mass Introduction, Homily and Prayer of the Faithful for the five Sundays of Lent of 2020.

Hence, may I request Your Eminence/Your Grace/Your Excellency to kindly extend your support and co-operation in promoting Caritas India's Annual Lenten Campaign in your Archdiocese/Diocese and organize a Diocesan level launch of the same on one of the Sundays of Lent this year, preferably the first Sunday, by involving the Lay Faithful of your Archdiocese/Diocese. I also request you to encourage the Priests in your Diocese to use the Liturgy Booklet compiled by Caritas India as it is based on the theme of this year.

As we commence the Holy Season of Lent, remembering the passion and death of our Lord, together with our own reparation and penance, let us also remind ourselves and our communities of the needs of the poor and our call to reach out to them in Christian charity and solidarity.


