Dialogue: The Path to Truth and Charity

The 34th CBCI Plenary Assembly concluded on Wednesday with a fervent appeal to uphold the secular values of the nation. The Plenary Assembly held at St. John's National Academy of Health Sciences, Bengaluru from 13-19, February 2020 was attended by Bishops Salvadore Lobo and Shyamal Bose from our diocese.

In a statement released at the end of the assembly, it said, "We, the 192 member Bishops of CBCI, prompted by our fidelity to Jesus Christ and unflinching loyalty to our beloved mother land reflected, meditated and deliberated on the ever relevant theme, "Dialogue: The Path to Truth and Charity." "The Church, the community of faith in Jesus Christ, has integral and all-inclusive dialogue at her heart. Indeed dialogue belongs to the very essence of the Christian faith. All through her history the Church has made earnest efforts to engage in dialogue at different levels. As a community of human beings the Church lives in civil society and body politic, continuously inspiring us to be loyal citizens of India. The noteworthy contribution of the Church in the field of education, health care and social transformation has been consistently acknowledged by the people of India," the statement said.

The CBCI expressed deep concern and anguish on what was happening in the country. "We are filled with hope inspired by faith and the innate goodness of all our fellow citizens. We appreciate the majority who uphold the secular values of our nation. We are determined to continue to collaborate in the work of building our great nation, Mother India. May the Blessed Virgin Mary, who manifested the exemplary spirit of dialogue through her maternal intercession, guide each one of us on the path of truth and charity!"

CBCI highlighted the hallmark of India's pluralism. "From ancient times, India has been a mosaic of many religions, cultures and languages with a strong Indian identity. What unites us is stronger and deeper than what divides us. We are proud of our Constitution that envisions a Sovereign, Socialist, Secular, Democratic, Republic which resolved to secure for all its citizens Justice, Liberty, Equality and Fraternity as enshrined in the Preamble. Justice is spelt out as social, economic and political; Liberty is explained as liberty of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship; and Equality is understood as equality of status and opportunity," the statement stressed.

"These Constitutional values form the ethos of Indian identity that promotes fraternity, dignity of the individual and unity and integrity of the nation. Every citizen must be ever vigilant against all attempts to undermine the ennobling human vision of the Constitution so that our beloved country ever remains united," it added.

According the CBCI, "Dialogue is rooted in the very vocation of the Church. Being open to dialogue, calls for being absolutely consistent with one's own religious tradition. Believers enter into each other's depth of life through dialogue."

Batting for right to life, dialogue should not be limited to those who are born; rather the right to life of the unborn must also be taken seriously into account. We believe that the human being is to be respected and treated as a person from the moment of conception, that each and every Dialogue in India should aim at collaboration in areas such as peace-building, protection of the environment, eradication of poverty and ensuring the human dignity of all, especially of women and children. Besides, it means that we condemn all wars, violence and terrorism that create insurmountable blocks to dialogue. We pledge ourselves to engage in a process of dialogue for a reconciled society.

"False nationalistic ideologies that instigate contempt for cultures other than the majoritarian dominant culture are capable of perpetrating atrocities. It is necessary to clarify the essential difference between patriotism and pseudo nationalism.

"We appeal to the State authorities to ensure that pseudo nationalism does not continue to give rise to new forms of totalitarianism. Together with the framers of the Constitution, we, the Catholic Bishops of India, affirm that religion shall not be a criterion for determining Indian citizenship. "In the end the church strongly believes that dialogue is indeed the path to truth and charity. It prayed that dialogue grows in every family, at all levels of the Church, among the Christians, among religions and cultures, and among the nations so that God's Kingdom of reconciliation, justice, peace and love may come," the statement concluded.

Ante Gabric S.J. A group of friends from Croatia had come in advance to prepare for the day with the parishioners. They prepared an exhibition based on the service and ministry of Fr. Gabric S.J. for the people of Sunderban. The celebration began with the concelebrated Holy Eucharist by Most Rev. Coadjutor Bishop Shyamal Bose, Rev. Fr. Ante, Fr. Molloy Mondal, Fr. K. The audience were spell bound for about 45 minutes with the continuous sequence of performances. The show was produced and presented by a group called *Shriek of Silence*. After a vote of thanks by Sr. Kiran, Headmistress, the celebration ended with a hymn to Mother Mary.

ST. MARY'S SCHOOL, KALYANPUR 40 YEARS IN THE SERVICE OF HUMANITY

St. Mary's School Kalyanpur in its present location was started in 1980. But its origin has to be traced back to at least another 10 years. St. Mary's School and the Sisters of Our Lady of the Missions, Commonly Known as the RNDM Sisters at Kalyanpur share a common history. At first when the Sisters came to Kalyanpur they had taken residence in the parish house in 1967 as there was no resident priest there. And, it is in the veranda of the parish house that the sisters started an English Medium School around the year 1970. About the same time when the Convent building was ready the church at Kalyanpur too was ready for inauguration in 1971. With that the school shifted along with the Sisters to the new convent. A new building was built for the growing school in the parish premises and was inaugurated on 13th January 1980 as full-fledged Bengali Medium Primary School and its administration was taken over by the Catholic Diocese of Baruipur. The Sisters continued to manage and assist the diocese in running the school. Sisters Dipti, Kurmila, Monica, Sherly, Tresiamma and Jessy, among others, made tremendous contribution in administering the school in the capacity of headmistress at different periods of its history. Remarkable among the teachers are Mrs. Pratima Chakraborty (38years), Mrs. Dorothy Mondal (28 Years), Mrs. Suprova Mondal (24 years) and Rita Gomes (20 years) who have contributed to the education of the poor children in the area till their retirement. The remuneration they received was nominal and yet they made the children produce better results than most other schools in the vicinity.

The education standard was good but the building's condition was appalling. Repeatedly major repairs were undertaken on the building. Still, by 2014 the condition of the school became very bad. It was at this time that the destiny of the school took another turn. Major repairs and renovation on the building was done. A decision was made to start the English Medium section and to gradually phase out the Bengali medium. The renovated building was inaugurated on 25th March 2015 by Rev. Dr. Felix Raj, Principal, St. Xavier's College, Kolkata and blessed by Most Rev. Salvadore Lobo. It has been also decided

that efforts will be made for the school to be upgraded to a High and higher secondary school. In the first year of starting the English Medium, the school had 49 children in Nursery and L.K.G. classes. Today it has 222 children in nursery to Class III. The school is growing and needs bigger infrastructure to accommodate the growing number of children and classes.

The school follows the CISCE curriculum for its academic studies. Beyond academics, the school also provides a rich and balanced programme of learning and co-curricular activities, all aimed at moulding the pupils into complete, disciplined and well-formed personality.

At St. Mary's School, they awaken the hidden potentials in their pupils not only for school, but for life. The school aims to create a happy, friendly and caring environment, where each individual can develop his/her personality to the full.

The school is entrusted to the maternal care of the Blessed Virgin Mary who is its patroness.
