Fr Provincial's Message: The Hope Beyond the Crucifixion

The life time experience of COVID-19 has shaken us and created panic in

human societies. It has taken over our families, our neighbourhood, our streets, our praying places, our jobs, our markets, our hospitals and places of social gatherings and isolated us completely. It has occupied our common spaces. It is uprooting us from the 'we' and forcing us to live in the 'I' world. Without discriminating class, race, caste and creed, it has injected fear, anxiety, uncertainty and dark shadows of death in all human beings. It has not spared neither geographical nor religious boundaries. For once, we do not talk about religion or ethnicity, but focus on human welfare and survival. In this desperate time humanity has become one.

The socio-political decisions of lockdown, which aims at controlling the spread of pandemic and restoring the confidence of people, have on the contrary raised many questions. It is not just the frightening experience of the pandemic, but for thousands it is a question of survival and fighting hunger. Millions of poor fear hunger may kill them first than the pandemic. For many it is the experience of Calvary.

Amidst all these we also hear the whispers of

courageous stories. Many, in particular medical practitioners and health workers, are making sacrifices in the service of thousands of victims all over the world and a few of them have already sacrificed their own lives. We hear the experiences of those suffering, of being both a victim and a witness, which has helped us to understand God's active role in our life and deepened our faith in Him.

In spite of conflicting thoughts and sentiments in our minds, the examples of life promoting angels fill us with hope. Even the small acts of reaching out to the needy and hungry, tells us that the spirit of God is present and active, irrespective of religion, language or culture. Even in suffering we see the hope beyond and a new life. We join our prayers together with the whole world for all those suffering from the COVID-19, that they may be able to experience the merciful hand of God and strength to endure all the hardships!
